1. The word 'absense' has been wrongly spelled. The correct spelling of the word is 'absence'.

All other words are correct in every aspect.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Absence (Noun): the state of being away from a place or person.

Energy (Noun): the strength and vitality required for sustained physical activity.

Stared (Verb): to gaze.

Dishwater (Noun): dirty water in which dishes have been washed.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

2. 'Academik' is the incorrect spelling of the word. The correct spelling is 'academic'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Realize (Verb): to cause to happen.

Flexible (Adjective): capable of bending easily.

Arrangements (Noun): the action, process, or result of arranging or being arranged.

Academic (Adjective): relating to education and scholarship.

Option D is hence the correct answer.



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3. The word 'except' does not make any logical sense here as we need a verb, not a preposition. It should be 'accept', which will give the sentence a proper meaning.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Asked (Verb): to say something in order to obtain an answer or some information.

Except (Preposition): not including; other than.

Accept (Verb): to consent to receive or undertake (something offered).

Owed (Verb): to have an obligation to pay or repay (something, especially money) in return for something received.

Repaid (Verb): to pay back (a loan).

Hence, option B is correct.

4. If we look thoroughly, one can find that 'excess' is out of context as sentence gives information about some 'the Touch lock also supports NFC' and 'cards' and 'excess' does not fit in any manner. 'Access' should have been used in place of it.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Addition (Noun): the action or process of adding something to something else.

Control (Noun): the power to influence or direct people's behaviour or the course of events.

Excess (Noun): an amount of something that is more than necessary, permitted, or desirable.

Access (Noun): the means or opportunity to approach or enter a place.

Included (Verb): to comprise or contain as part of a whole.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

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5. All of the given words are correctly used except 'social', which is completely out of context as the sentence talks about 'gain access to the dollar-based international' and can't be a 'social' system. It should be 'financial' system.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Desperate (Adjective): feeling or showing a hopeless sense that a situation is so bad as to be impossible to deal with.

Economic (Adjective): relating to economics or the economy.

Social (Adjective): relating to society or its organization.

Financial (Adjective): relating to finance.

Investment (Noun): the action or process of investing money for profit.

Hence, option C is correct.

6. All of the given words are correctly used except 'playing', which is completely out of context as 'online playing in schools' is absurd. It should be 'online studying in schools'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Countries (Noun): a nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.

Would (Verb): (expressing the conditional mood) indicating the consequence of an imagined event or situation.

Playing (Verb): to engage in activity for enjoyment and recreation rather than a serious or practical purpose.

Studying (Verb): to devote time and attention to gaining knowledge of (an academic subject), especially by means of books.

Athletics (Noun): the sport of competing in track and field events, including running races and various competitions in jumping and throwing.

Option C is hence the correct answer.

7. The only misspelled word among all is 'complaints'. The correct spelling of the word is 'complaints'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Complaints (Noun): a statement that something is unsatisfactory or unacceptable.

Department (Noun): a division of a large organization such as a government, university, or business, dealing with a specific area of activity.

Ascended (Verb): to move up to a higher social or professional rank.

Leadership (Noun): the action of leading a group of people or an organization.

Hence, option A is correct.

8. 'Aroussed' is the incorrect spelling of the word. The correct spelling is 'aroused'.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Aroused (Verb): to evoke or awaken (a feeling, emotion, or response).

Curiosity (Noun): a strong desire to know or learn something.

Strains (Verb): to force (a part of one's body or oneself) to make an unusually great effort.

Considerably (Adverb): by a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly.

Option A is hence the correct answer.

9. All of the given words are correctly used.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Unprecedented (Adjective): never done or known before.

Attendance (Noun): the number of people present at a particular place or event.

Struggles (Verb): to strive to achieve or attain something in the face of difficulty or resistance.

Empty (Adjective): containing nothing; not filled or occupied.

Hence, option E is correct.

- 10.** If we look thoroughly, one can find that 'gain' is out of context as sentence gives information about some 'lawsuit' and to dismiss it and 'gain' with 'customers' does not fit in any manner. 'Charge' should have been used in place of it.

Also, meaning of the given words:

Seeking (Verb): to attempt to find (something).

Arguing (Verb): to give reasons or cite evidence in support of an idea, action, or theory, typically with the aim of persuading others to share one's view.

Applies (Verb): to be applicable or relevant.

Gain (Verb): obtain or secure (something wanted or desirable).

Charge (Verb): to demand (an amount) as a price for a service rendered or goods supplied.

Hence, option D is the correct answer.



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
