Directions : In each of the following questions a grammatically correct and meaningful sentence is given with four words given in bold in each. Which of the following words should replace each other to form a meaningful and grammatically correct sentence? The meaning can be different from the one in question.

1. They were seeking **(1) attempts** on the ground situation **(2) immediate** the revocation of the State's special status, Pakistan's **(3) feedback** at interference and the **(4) post** demands of the people.

9. Just about seven lakh samples of Covid-19 were **half (A)** on Sunday, the **achieved (B)** since August 10 and less than **tested (C)** of the number that was **lowest (D)** last Thursday.

10. The film is **based (A)** on **author (B)** Nancy Springer's Sherlock Holmes spin off, Enola Holmes **mysteries (C)** that she **wrote (D)** between 2006 and 2010.

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Explanations:

1. If we start from (4) , we see that 'post demands' doesn't make sense. If we replace it with (1) 'attempts' or (3) 'feedback' it still remain meaningless. Only (2) 'immediate' makes it meaningful: 'immediate demands'.

Thus we got 2-4.

Again the phrase at (3) 'Pakistan's feedback' is also make no sense. Replacement with (1) 'attempts' will make it meaningful.

Thus 1-3 is also correct.

Correct sentence:

They were seeking feedback on the ground situation post the revocation of the State's special status, Pakistan's attempts at interference and the immediate demands of the people.

Option (C) is correct.

2. Read the sentence near (3) , it doesn't make sense. If we check with (1) , we get: 'difficult (3) times' which makes sense.

Rest all look fine.

Thus the replacement is 1-3.

Correct sentence:

"Chief Justice of India S. A. Bobde said the **country** was already **going** through difficult **times** and an endeavour should be made to **maintain** peace."

Option (A) is correct.



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3. Sentence at (2) doesn't make sense. If it was 'under the (2) appointment' it would have been little good, but the present sentence near (2) is totally meaningless.

Replacement with (3) **ambit** can make it meaningful.

Thus the replacement is 2-3.

Correct sentence:

"Delhi **Police** is under the **ambit** of the Lt. Governor, who is **appointed** by the Central government and is not **under** the Delhi government."

Option (C) is correct.

4. The sentence is correct in its present form.

Option (E) is correct.

5. First two bold words look at right place.

The (3) doesn't make sense because sentence after it 'the Rann Utsav' is name of a festival. It is meaningless to say 'between a festival'. Someone could be between two things, between a festival is meaningless.

Thus 3-4 is the replacement.

Correct sentence:

"(1) **Tourists** from across the (2) **world** come to stay at the Tent City (3) **during** the Rann Utsav (4) **between** December and February."

Option (D) is correct.

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6. The statement is regarding the US disease expert's view. All words are correctly placed and need not to be changed any further.

Therefore, option E is the correct answer.

7. The statement is regarding the vaccine and its trials which is related to Pune's Serum Institute. If we interchange A with D, the sentence will become meaningful. No other replacement is required in the sentence to make it meaningful.

The correct sentence will be:

Just three days after it had held back its approval, an expert committee of India's drug regulatory body has given its go-ahead to Pune's Serum Institute to test the Oxford University vaccine candidate in India.

This makes Option C the correct choice among the given options.

8. The statement is regarding the Nepal government recently taken new decision. If we interchange B with C, the sentence will become meaningful and no other replacement is required in the sentence to make it meaningful.

The correct sentence will be:

The Nepal government will send its recently revised map to India, the United Nations, and the international community by the middle of August, a minister has said.

This makes Option D the correct choice among the given options.

9. The phrase "samples were" need a verb "**tested**" instead of "**half**" because samples are '**tested**' and no other verb from the sentence fits with 'samples', this ensures A and C can be interchanged and the correct option must start with C. This ruled out the possibilities of options A, B and C straightaway.

Besides, the phrase “the **achieved** since August 10” is logically incorrect as it makes no logical sense, so this must be interchanged with ‘D’ and the correct order should be CDAB.

Evidently, option D is the correct answer.

- 10.** All phrases are correctly placed and rightly used and need not any further changes. The sentence is correct in both ways; contextually and grammatically.

Evidently, option E is the correct answer.



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
